<p>Garbage is collected weekly at homes within Beaverton city limits. Beaverton uses an automated collection system in most areas of the city. Garbage is picked up between 6 am and 6 pm.</p>	<p><i>Movie</i> – automated truck picking up a roll cart on a street</p>
	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> to JPEG</p>
<p>Most customers in Beaverton have a 32 gallon roll cart, but you can request a larger one if you need it. A typical garbage service set out includes a garbage cart, a yard debris cart and red recycling bins.</p>	<p><i>JPEG</i> Display - Stationary Pict of 90 gallon, 60 gallon and 32 gallon cart side by side</p>
	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> into movie</p>
<p>Garbage should be placed into your cart and the lid should be able to close. If garbage is stuffed into the container and does not fall freely when tipped, the hauler may leave the material in your cart.</p> <p>Your bin should be placed at the curb by 6 am on the day of pick up. The cart should be placed so that front is facing the street. Your cart should be 5 feet from other containers and obstacles (to allow the arm to get to each container) and there should not be anything overhead that the automated arm could hit when lifting the cart. Carts should be removed from the curb within 24 hours of being emptied.</p>	<p><i>Movie</i> – resident placing large bag into full bin, with lid not able to close. Resident shakes his head. He takes it out and then takes the bin to the curb with the lid closed. Recycling and yard debris carts are already at the curb. Resident adjusts the bins to meet set out criteria (5 feet apart)...then truck approaches, lifts container and sets back down.</p>

	<i>TRANSITION into movie</i>
If containers are not prepared properly, your hauler should leave a mis prep notice should be attached to the container explaining why your container was not picked up. If the hauler does not leave a note, please call them to ask why your cart was not emptied.	<i>Movie – show a garbage person putting a misprep tag on a roll cart (show cart that is overfull, with lid flung open.</i>
