<p>Hi, I’m Stephen Sykes from the City of Beaverton’s Solid Waste and Recycling Team. I’d like to talk with you about preparing your yard debris for collection in the City of Beaverton. Because, we thought you would like to know.</p> 	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> Zoom into bust shot</p>
<p>Yard debris is collected weekly at homes within Beaverton city limits. Residents receive a 60 gallon yard debris cart when garbage service is started.</p>	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> into movie <i>Movie</i> – street with carts out and a yard debris truck grabbing and lifting a yard debris cart.</p>
	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> into jpeg</p>
<p>If you do not have a cart at your house, please contact your garbage hauler.</p>	<p><i>JPEG</i> – list of haulers and contact info</p>
	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> to movie</p>
<p>Have you ever wondered what can go into your yard debris cart? The following materials are accepted:</p> <div data-bbox="120 1184 797 1444" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • leaves • weeds • grass clippings • branches* • prunings* • garden waste </div> <p>Branches and prunings can not be greater than 4 inches in diameter and 36 inches long.</p>	<p><i>Movie</i> – show close up of Stephen’s hands placing items (in order of bullets) a yard debris cart. Follow items on list showing each one and placing into bin. <i>Narrator reads text as movie plays.</i></p>
	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> into movie</p>
<p>It is important not to use plastic bags, metal clips, or plastic ties to set out your yard debris. Plastics and metals do not decompose which will contaminate your materials and cause your materials to be rejected by the hauler.</p>	<p><i>Movie</i> – show Stephen’s hands pulling out on e of the materials on the list</p>
	<p><i>TRANSITION</i> into jpeg</p>

<p>Among the things that are not acceptable in your yard debris cart are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • dirt • stumps • metal • food waste • sod • lumber • household garbage • rocks • plastic • animal waste • If you have questions about what is acceptable, please call. 	<p>JPEG – showing list of these materials as narrator reads list.</p>
<p>The maximum weight limit for a typical 60 gallon cart is 100 pounds. If your container is not 60 gallons, check with your hauler for weight limits or call the recycling hotline at 503 526 2665. If your container exceeds this weight or contains unacceptable items, it will not be collected.</p> <p>It is important not to stuff materials into your cart, because they will not empty properly.</p>	<p>TRANSITION into movie</p> <p><i>Movie –show truck lifting a cart that is stuffed with materials... show hauler trying to empty, but branches caught in container. Show some materials falling out of stuffed container onto the ground.</i></p>
<p>Once full, your container should be placed at your curb (not in the street) by 6 AM on the day of collection. Please place the container 5 feet from any nearby obstacles. If the lid does not close completely, you may be charged an extra fee.</p> <p>Your cart should be taken off of the curb within 24 hours of being emptied.</p>	<p>TRANSITION into movie</p> <p><i>Movie : show resident walking an overfull (branches) yard debris cart out to curb.</i></p> <p><i>Show resident removing branches and lid closing.</i></p>
<p>Extra materials can be placed next to your bin in kraft bags for a fee of \$3.00 each. These should be placed next to your cart. Kraft bags can be purchased at many local retail stores.</p>	<p>TRANSITION into jpeg</p> <p>JPEG Display Image: extra kraft bags next to bins (add \$3.00 charge text over image).</p>
