

According to the Oregon Public Meeting and Records Laws, meeting minutes shall include at least the following: members present, motions, proposals, resolutions, orders, ordinances, and measures proposed and their disposition, results of all votes and, except for public bodies consisting of more than 25 members, unless requested by a member of that body, the vote of each member by name; the substance of any discussion on any matter; and subject to the Public Records Laws, a reference to any document discussed at the meeting. Minutes need not be a verbatim transcript and the meeting does not have to be recorded unless otherwise required by law.

**ITEMS DISCUSSED:**

The June 21, 2011 meeting of the West Slope NAC was held at the Valley Community Presbyterian Church. Following the call to order by co-chair Sid Snyder and mutual introductions by those present, the following items were presented to and discussed by the NAC members and visitors present at the meeting:

**Reports:**

The on-duty shift of TVF&R Engine 65, gave a brief talk about fire safety, particularly with respect to fireworks and barbecues, in honor of the summer season (if summer ever really happens). Officer Jim White of the Beaverton Police Department gave a brief report of police activities in the NAC area in April 2011, the most recent information available. There had been five crimes, including one assault, one residential burglary, two narcotics offenses and one unclassified. Further information, including a distribution map of reported offenses can be found on the Beaverton Police Dept website. A calendar of upcoming city events, including a free document shredding service in the Tektronix parking lot in August can also be found on the website. The police department received a grant and will be conducting a special enforcement program on respecting pedestrian rights of way in marked crosswalks over the summer. There was a discussion of state laws and local ordinances relating to this.

Alma Flores, Economic Development Manager for the City of Beaverton gave a report on her department. It includes four and one half personnel, and is focused on business recruitment, business retention, "economic gardening" and the "Main Street" program which is part of the Beaverton Urban Renewal Agency. A Beaverton Downtown Business Association was established six months ago. There was considerable discussion of the proposed urban renewal plan and associated matters, and Ms. Flores responded to numerous questions.

Sid Snyder reminded everyone of the Picnic in the Park event scheduled for August 3 in Camille Park. There will be no NAC meetings in July and August, and the September meeting will be scheduled for the third Tuesday in September at West Sylvan Middle School.

There not being a quorum present, consideration of the minutes of the May 17, 2011 meeting of the West Slope NAC was deferred until the next meeting.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was adjourned at 8:30 pm upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried.
