Meeting called to order at 7pm by Chairman Jerry Noble. Welcome and introductions were made.

Officer DeFrain Recap

In June 2012 Officer DeFrain will present to the NAC a comprehensive crime program presentation.

The police have had good communication from a program called "Tip Soft", a way that you can text a tip or crime to the police. Text the word "crime" and type in the information and the police will follow-up on the tip. The information is sent to the police but the source is anonymous.

The officer encouraged the community to check out the police website and "most wanted" individuals in the Beaverton area. There have been 15 most wanted individuals arrested with 22 individuals outstanding.

Tammy expressed concerns about cars running through the traffic light ramps on 217. The police are aware of the situation.

There has been an increase in theft from vehicles and you are encouraged to lock your vehicle doors and use appropriate precautions, including not leaving valuables in your vehicle.

Neighborhood Concerns

Judy Donovan, a Vose resident who is on the Beaverton Historical Society Board, discussed the history of a house on Denney road. The house was built in 1890, was a homestead of the Denney family of which Judy is a direct descendent. The house is located east of the Vose Elementary School and is owned by Oregon Decorative Rock. Judy is concerned that the house will be torn down by the business owner and would like to preserve the house and history if possible.

Tammy suggested a history date in order to collect donations to renovate the house. Ben suggested that Judy should speak with the business owner regarding her concern and goal to preserve the history of the Denney house.

Blair Thomas from the Parks Advisory Committee was present to discuss a survey that he is conducting regarding smoking in the public parks. He is getting his Master in Public Health. The goal of the survey is to get input through April on the possibility of banning smoking at public parks in Beaverton or at big public events at the park. Jerry asked if there had been complaints or cigarette butts littering the park

area. Blair indicated that there has been no complaints or excessive littering at the parks. The survey was completed by those present at the meeting and returned to Blair. It was recommended that the survey be put on the Tualatin Parks and Recreation website in order for more survey input from the community.

Treasurer's Report

The balance is currently \$2,815.24. There was \$11.70 deposited on February 24th. The only outstanding requirement is that Penny needs to sign bank paperwork and has been encouraged to stop by the Oregonians FCU. Jerry will follow-up with Penny regarding the signature requirement.

Judy Donovan inquired about how the NAC raises money throughout the year. Tammy outlined the Farmers Market event, Recycling Day and grant matching options.

Approval of Previous Minutes

Henry Kane made a motion to approve the minutes from prior meetings Tammy seconded the motion. The minutes from the 01/19/2012 and 02/16/2012 meetings were approved unanimously.
