Jerry Noble, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Welcome and Introductions were made.

**Fire Department Report - TVF&R – Steve Segar**

- Calls during the month of July 2012: 806 Emergency Medical Responses, 128 Fire responses, 24 hazardous conditions, and 42 other calls.
- Vose NAC calls: 5 fire calls, 56 Emergency responses, 1 Hazardous call, and 2 others.
- There is an MDA campaign at this time. Off duty fire fighters will be at Hwy 217 and Beaverton Hillsdale Highway tomorrow, August 17<sup>th</sup>, with a boot to collect donations.
- Cooling stations have been set up during the hot weather. One has been set up at the First Baptist Church.
- The new CPR class criteria is to use hands only chest compression; 100 per minute. The American Heart Association advocates good quality compressions.
- There is a burning ban in effect. Outboard and backyard burning is prohibited. This does not apply to recreational warming fires.
- The West Slope Fire building is being built on SW 103rd and should be complete in October.
- FJ cruisers are being used as alternate response vehicles. There is one paramedic per vehicle and if needed a truck will be requested.

**Beaverton Police Report**

**Officer White's Recap**

- Crimes committed in the month of March included: burglary at 8th & Franklin, vandalism in the Lombard & Allen Blvd area, aggravated assault on Iron Horse Lane, an auto theft.
- School starts Tuesday September 4th. High school classes start at 7:45 AM.
- There is a car seat clinic this Saturday from 8 AM until noon at Kuni BMW.
- The Beaverton city parade is September 8th and there is a 5 K run afterwards.
- There is a bike event on September 9th; it is posted at Starbucks.
- The RV near King Blvd was discussed, it evidently keeps being moved to other locations.

**Neighborhood Concerns and Announcements**

- Donna Reed has problems at her residence with transients and someone threw an incendiary item at her house. She asked for assistance from the NAC. NAC members urged her to work with the Police and suggested she reach out to her immediate neighbors. Officer White was present and apprised of the situation.
- Traffic Commission TC 695. Jerry Noble testified at the recent city council on the technicality that prevented the Vose NAC from appealing the traffic commission decision on TC 695. He reported that City Council sent the issue back to the traffic commission. One free traffic appeal per year for each NAC is now being considered.
- Nupur reported that she is having an open house at The wonder Years Learning Center on Wednesday August 22nd, from 5:30 PM to 7 PM.

### **Treasurer's Report**

Tammy Emmert, reported that there is \$1389.94 in checking and \$1505.66 in savings.

### **Approval of previous Vose NAC minutes from July 21, 2012**

Corrections were made to the previous meeting minutes. A motion was made to approve the minutes as corrected. Motion seconded and passed. (Correction was to add: Jim Persey, Greenway NAC, as having helped with the Sunday Trailways event.

- Farmer's Market Booth Review – Tammy Emmert reported on the financials and that we will be receiving a refund.
- Vose Neighborhood Picnic Planning - Penny will verify with THPRD that the tables and port a potty will be delivered. All were invited to help, after this NAC meeting, to put together gift bags for the kids to be handed out at the picnic. We are making 50 for the girls and 50 for the boys.
