Meeting called to order at 7:07 PM by Chairman Henry Kane. Introductions were made.

Correspondence, Announcements, and Neighborhood Concerns

Henry Kane read a thank you letter he wrote to Mayor Doyle and the City Council for providing a Trash Can at the corner of Denney Rd. and Hall Blvd. He cited Jason Wachs, Neighborhood Program Coordinator, as a facilitator. (Include as part of these minutes).

Henry shared the News Report in the Beaverton Valley Times, March 14, 2013 “Beaverton earns Oregon’s Safest City designation.” He requests this be made part of the minutes.

Nupur Sinha had questions about signs that she posts at her Day Care on Denney Road. Miles Glowacki, from the Neighborhood office, said there is an ordinance on signs. He suggested she call the City Code Services Office or he can have the Officer call her.

Jason Wachs, from the Neighborhood office is out on family “Maternity Leave” and Miles Glowacki will be the main contact at the Neighborhood office.

Beaverton Police Department – Officer White reported on the Vose Neighborhood Crime statistics. There were a total of 32 crimes in November 2012. There were no “Person Crimes.” Fourteen were vandalism crimes. Citizens Academy started in early March. Free document shredding is 4/20/13 at Tektronix. Car Seat Clinic is 4/20/13 at Kuni Collision Center and another 5/4/13 at Beaverton City Hall.

Guest Speaker – Daniel Vazquez is the Cultural inclusion Coordinator for the City of Beaverton. He works under the Office of the Mayor. This is an outreach program for Beaverton’s ethnic residents. One fourth of Beaverton’s population is comprised of foreign-born and those who consider themselves ethnic. There are 96 languages spoken in the City. Daniel speaks 6 languages. Daniel will be working with Portland State University on a diversity study and minority outreach plan. City

officials and Minority leaders will meet for two days in June. They will review the needs of the city's minority communities. Daniel can be reached at dvazquez@beavertonoregon.gov.

Treasurers Report – None.

Old Business

Secretary/Recorder - A Volunteer is needed to record the minutes of the Vose NAC meetings.

Matching Grant for Picnic – Henry gave an overview of the Matching Grant funds available. Penny reported that she turned in the paperwork for a matching grant to help fund the food at the Vose NAC picnic.

Pedestrian crossing on Hall Blvd for Fanno Creek Trail – Henry Kane reported that Mayor Doyle made some additional provisions for the crossing before signing. The mid-block crossing with flashing yellow, and a red light, could be installed by the end of 2013.

New Business

Beaverton's Recycling Day is Saturday, June 1, 2013 from 9 AM to 2 PM. Volunteers are needed and the sign-up sheet is available. Shifts are (AM to 12 Noon and 11 AM to 3 PM. Refreshments including breakfast snacks will be provided. The location is the former Westgate Theater site on Cedar Hills Blvd., north of Canyon Road. This is a way for our Vose NAC to earn money for our events and programs. \$6,000 will be divided amongst 11 NACS based on volunteer hours. It is not necessary to work an entire shift; help as you are able. There are light duty and unloading up to 30 pounds categories.

Beaverton Farmers Market – Vose NAC members are needed to volunteer at the market to sell Beaverton Bakery pastries, soda and water. This is another way we are able to earn money for the NAC.
