Question: There is a rumor that thieves in Stonegate are collecting VIN numbers and getting dealers to make new keys. It is very unlikely that a dealer would make a key just based on the VIN number.

Owners should not cover up the VIN number as they will likely be stopped if they do.

Question: Any news on the break-ins in the Bethany area? This is Washington County jurisdiction.

Question: Heritage Parkway/185th is in both Beaverton and Washington Country. Who responds to emergencies? Both services will respond depending on who is closest. Call 911, and they will dispatch the nearest officers.
