Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue Report

Mayor Doyle was unexpectedly delayed in Europe. Randy has been the Mayor's assistant for one year now. Major crime is down 15-17% this year and Beaverton is recognized as the safest city in the North West. Mayor Doyle attends approximately 1500 meetings per year. Current plans from the Mayor's office include:

- Urban renewal to redevelop the downtown core.
