BCCI report – Richard Pickett.

Last meeting of the BCCI was on April 26th, 2009.

Discussion concerned Beaverton Recycling, planning and policy.

The date for the annual Beaverton Recycle event will be June 13th, 2009 from 9:00 to 2:00.

Volunteer shifts are 1.) 8:00 to 12:00, and 2.) 11:00 to 3:00. Each shift represents one hour of training and 3 hours of work. Please sign up online, with Richard, or by email to David Kamin.

Janice Deardorf, former Mayoral Assistant, visited the BCCI Meeting. The new Mayoral assistant to Mayor Denny Doyle is Randy Elite.

Police Chief Spaulding also attended the recent meeting and discussed his background and how the community he is from (Fullerton, CA) and Beaverton have many similarities. Chief Spaulding is focusing on meeting, one on one, with each individual member of the police force, and on understanding the culture and history of Beaverton.

He is planning to implement a Police Cadet program, and will be seeking to find well qualified 21 year olds with some college to attend the Police Academy.

Neighborhood Summit was held by the BCCI at City Hall on 4/18/2009.

The theme this year was “Living Leaner and Greener”

Rhonda Coakly chaired and there were 185 attendees.

The vendor participation was higher than last year.

Cindy Tatham, our presenter this evening, also presented at the Neighborhood Summit and was very popular. Changes that BCCI hopes to make next year are to make the event: 1.) more kid friendly, 2.) provide more information for renters, and 3.) next year the BCCI will provide incentives to turn in the surveys that were distributed.

The Visioning Committee is in the process of collecting data throughout the City at this time.

Presentation – Cindy Tatham, Waste Reduction Program Coordinator, City of Beaverton

A Video on Recycling will be presented to put us in the mindset about how trash is recycled.

Cindy works primarily with commercial entities but does work with other groups.

A presentation on the history of garbage collection was shown.

Regarding recycling, the City of Beaverton has no issues with paper, a few issues with plastic, largely related to plastic tubs, and the City is proud that the policy has always been to keep glass separate.

Process is: house to truck to transfer station to semi truck to landfill.

50% of trash is from businesses.

18% of trash is from construction and demolition.

The rest is from single family and multi-family housing.

Beaverton is considered the “Best in the Region” (which encompasses the Metro area) for recycling.

There is even a “Will Call” rate for light users with a low fee and a minimum of 4 pick-ups a year.

No other area of service in our region has this level of service at less cost.

David Kamin asked about the Bottle Bill changes.

Washington County Commissioners did not support mandatory recycling.

David Kamin closed the meeting shortly after 9:00.
