No Treasurer's report

No expected changes as no bills or income believed to have occurred since our last meeting.

BCCI report:

- Inside the Beaverton Building, on the right across from the Washington County visitors' center, open wall for rotating viewing of a local artist.
- Second Vision Committee survey was to 7,500 residents up from the 6,500 five years ago. Categorized plans again.
- Boards and Commissions reviewed, less than 25% are not direct citizen's, but near or between areas.
- New way-finding signage coming soon with a three phase signs starting with pedestrian signs near the Creekside District. Eventually all over explaining landmarks or high points.

Old Business:

None to report, a quick update on meetings of the past month was briefly discussed. Citizens are encouraged to apply for a Boards and commissions opening. Also some training programs encourage RSVP or they may be cancelled.

New Business:

Discuss McKay book drive. Kindergarten was the most impacted so that is our focus. The group will look into boxes and bags to leave in stores.

This ties into the second agenda item; The NAC booth at the Beaverton Farmer's Market. The market runs almost 9 months a year and a couple of NAC's have been manning it each week. Now the BCCI is wondering if each NAC would like to take over the booth for either a set of dates or in some rotation. Taking over for consecutive weeks might be difficult, imagine trying to find volunteers for four weeks in a row during July. However, a rotating schedule of once per month or every other month might work.

The board did decide on two suggestions. The first is that while each NAC should sell something following the recommendations of the Farmers Market. The second is that a consistent product should be sold each week. Bottled water is an easy option. The main thing is the booth should sell two items each week, and one for that NAC and another that all NACs sell. Finally, a bag or box should be included for the book drive as several NACs are hosting them.

Finally general questions and comments in the area included a recap of Laurelwood, and the CIP work of Denney. Finally some general questions about rules and options, and how they affect next-door neighbors. Any issues can be reported to the city's code compliance department, or you may reach out to a NAC board member who can check on your behalf.
