Police Report

There was an incident at Autumn Ridge Park recently which BPD responded to, which turned out to be a misunderstanding. The new Police Chief, Geoff Spalding, starts on February 2nd. There has been a rash of robberies, county wide. One person is now in custody. The City has learnt from the recent bad weather, and will preempt future snow storms and deice earlier.

Presentation. Lidia Lyon, Ride Connection.

Transportation resources for older adults, and people with disabilities. The services offered are:

- Information about transportation services in the region
- Assistance planning your trip using public transportation
- Travel training on how to use public transportation through our RideWise program
- Neighborhood shuttles to local destinations
- Door to door transportation

Donations are always required, of either funds or vehicles. Ride Connection is a non-profit, and works with over 30 community partners. Last year they provided 371,000 rides to 10,500 individuals. A 20 minute intake interview is required, and they usually require a 4 day notice of requiring a ride.

Volunteers are needed for driving, office duties, printing, committee work, and fund development. The ride service is provided free, but they request a \$1.50 donation.

Walker Road Bridge Project, Melissa Nourigat

Melissa presented some bridge designs and cost estimates. The bridge could be steel, wood, or aluminum which could be removed and re-used if Walker Road is widened. The City will donate volunteer hours to the project. Melissa requested \$28 for printing materials which was approved.

BCCI Report, Richard Pickett

The November meeting was attended by the Mayor and the Mayor elect. Mayor Drake received a plaque for service to the City. Next year there will be new ideas, and support for the NACs. The chair will be Eric Schmidt, vice chair is Ray Bowman, Treasurer is Terry Lawler, and recorder is Richard Pickett.
