BEAVERTON MAYOR DENNY DOYLE APPOINTED AS LEAGUE OF OREGON CITIES PRESIDENT

BEAVERTON, Ore. – Beaverton Mayor Denny Doyle was elected 2017 president of the League of Oregon Cities (LOC) during its annual conference last week in Salem. The LOC is governed by a 16-member board of directors, composed of elected and appointed officials from across the state. His term begins Jan. 1, 2017.

Mayor Doyle has served as Beaverton's mayor since January 2009, prior to which he spent 14 years on the Beaverton City Council. Mayor Doyle currently serves on a variety of local, regional and national boards and committees, including the board of the National League of Cities and as vice chair of the Advanced Manufacturing Task Force for the U.S. Conference of Mayors. Mayor Doyle also served as vice president of the League of Oregon Cities during the 2016 calendar year.

"I'm looking forward to serving as the League of Oregon Cities president throughout this next year," said Mayor Denny Doyle. "I strongly believe that the League is a great resource for our cities, a great partner and I will work hard to ensure that the League has a successful year."
