

ITEMS DISCUSSED:

The October 18, 2016 meeting of the West Slope NAC was held at the West Sylvan Middle School. Following the call to order by Chair Carl Tebbe, and mutual introductions by those present, the following items were presented to and discussed by the NAC members and visitors present at the meeting:

Officer Michel Wilson, of the Beaverton Police Department gave a report on police activity in the NAC area for the preceding period, and distributed a print out of the activity, attached to these minutes, showing various offenses for the preceding period, and the year to date, broken out by type of offense. She reminded the meeting how to report traffic problems on the police department and city websites. The West Slope NAC area continues to be an area with minimal activity. Officer Wilson also distributed the attached schedule of various events, including car seat clinics and free document shredding events.

Sabrina Taylor Schmit, representing THPRD gave a brief report of the Park District's activities, including the progress of planning for the neighborhood park in the NAC area and the events involving THPRD during the coming holiday season. THPRD will be collecting items for distribution to families in need. She answered a number of questions regarding the neighborhood park.

Anita Slatinsky and Elena Sasin , from the City of Beaverton community Development gave a presentation on the process of updating the City's comprehensive plan. They explained what that process involved, and why it was being done. They distributed maps showing the various zones into which the City was divided for planning purposes and solicited information regarding the needs and wants of the NAC's residents. Several NAC residents responded that the primary need of the area was better pedestrian access and safety on Canyon Lane, which is the only access into and out of the neighborhood, is narrow, winding, partially bordered by drainage ditches, and dangerous for pedestrians. There was an extensive discussion of these issues, with the City representatives taking and answering questions.

Noel Castro, owner of Citadel Patrol, which proposes to operate a private security patrol service, and offers instruction in self defense, in the general SW Portland, Tigard Beaverton, Aloha area, gave a brief description of his company and its planned activities.

There was no treasurer's report nor a report from the BCCI representative.
