Meeting Minutes

Committee Members Present: Patricia Longua, Richard Eyde, Ryan Hoppes, Laura Mitchell, Lisa Stiller, Erin Woolley, and staff liaison Megan Cohen.

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. Megan provided an update regarding the presentation schedule and went over ground rules for the dedicated ten minutes for question and answer. Megan kept time for presenting organizations.

HomePlate Youth Services: Bridget Calfee and a youth in the program presented the organization's request for \$20,000 to support a day time drop-in center at the new space that was recently opened in Central Beaverton. The space supports youth experiencing homeless or housing instability and funds would be used to support staff salaries, youth support expenses, and communication.

Business Education Compact: Darrin Marks presented the organization's request for \$8,000 to strengthen and stabilize Business Education Compact operations, which creates partnerships between businesses and schools to provide hands-on learning experiences to historically underserved students in STEM. Funds would be used to support strategic reorganizing and for diversifying funding streams.

Virginia Garcia Memorial Foundation: Michele Haynes presented the organization's request for \$20,000 to expand culturally appropriate community dental services that are provided to elementary and middle school students in the Beaverton School District. Funds would be used for the salaries, supplies, equipment, travel, and training for the sealant dental team.

Bridge Meadows: Renee Moseley and Derenda Schubert presented the organization's request for \$20,000 to serve foster children, adoptive parents, and elders at the Beaverton intergenerational housing site that will open in Beaverton this fall. Funds would be used to support the Community Support Specialist position, which is responsible for program implementation.

Holy Trinity Catholic Church: Al Schmitt presented the organization's request for \$20,000 to support the Beaverton Backpack Program. 100% of the funds would be used to purchase food for backpacks that are sent home with low-income students with the essential ingredients for healthy, complete, nutritious meals.

Store to Door: Eumi Wymbys and Kiersten Ware presented the organization's request for \$5,000 to increase enrollment of and services to diverse clients by providing affordable, personal, volunteer-based grocery shopping and delivery service. Funds would support the client outreach coordinator position.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, April 27 at 5:30 pm in the 1st Floor Fanno Creek Room of The Beaverton Building.
