Meeting Minutes

Committee Members Present: Patricia Longua, Richard Eyde, Ryan Hoppes, Laura Mitchell, Lisa Stiller, Erin Woolley, and staff liaison Megan Cohen.

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. Laura made a motion to disqualify Open Door Housing Works from the process for not attending their interview. Ryan seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Megan kept time for presenting organizations.

CASA for Children: Anne Marie Johnson presented the organization's request for \$15,000 to support educational achievement for children in foster care by training CASA volunteers. Funding would be used to support the salaries of four CASA supervisors, curriculum development, and outcome/evaluation measurement.

Boys and Girls Aid: Andrea Logan Sanders presented the organization's request for \$10,000 to provide housing and supportive services for youth ages 16-23 who are transition out of homelessness and into housing and self-sufficiency. Funds would be used to provide direct assistance to youth in the program.

Ecumenical Ministries: Jenny Pratt, Jane Turville, and a former participant presented the organization's request for \$18,000 to the Second Home Program. The program serves homeless teens who wish to complete their high school education by matching them with a home provider. Funds would be used to support program personnel.

Youth Contact: Judy Harris presented the organization's request for \$15,000 to provide school-based and outpatient behavioral health programs to youth and families in the Beaverton School District, ensuring they develop healthy behaviors, receive enrollment assistance with OHP, and connect to resources. Funds would support personnel.

Neighborhood Health Center: Alynn Vienot, Tegan Klein, and Michelle Farmer presented the organization's request for \$27,693 to integrate dental services into the Merlo Station High School school-based health center. Funds would support the personnel, equipment, and supplies necessary to establish and sustain services.

Just Compassion of East Washington County: Donna Krauthoefer and Jeanne Jamison presented the organization's request for \$15,000 to support a housing advocacy team that would work with homeless adults to overcome obstacles in maintaining housing stability. Funds would be used for a coordinator position and associated program costs.

St. Matthew Lutheran Church's Special Church/Community Action Team: The organization presented their request for \$9,000 to provide pantry/food delivery services to Beaverton households. 100% of the funds would be used to purchase food.

Welcome Home Coalition: No call/no show.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 10 at 5:30 pm in the 1st Floor Fanno Creek Room of The Beaverton Building.
