Beaverton Police Report

Aquatic Center Phase II Renovation Project: The Aquatic Center (50 Meter Pool at 158th and Walker Road) due to unforeseen complications there is a bit of a delay in the project. The new projected reopening date is Monday, January 8, 2018 (tentative). The major projects being completed include resurfacing of the pool tank, replacement of the pool area deck, redesign of the west side berm in the pool area, paint pool area and resurface dressing room floors. We encourage swimmers to check our website for comparable programs at our other indoor pools (Aloha, Beaverton, Conestoga, Harman, and Sunset).

Inclement Weather: THPRD programs, classes, and sponsored activities may be delayed or canceled when weather conditions warrant it. To check the status of park district activities/facility hours, please contact our 24-hour hotline at 503-614-4018 or go to our website at www.thprd.org for updated information. Please keep in mind the safety of our patrons and staff are our priority, when in doubt, please contact the hotline or facility before you attempt to travel.

Greenway Park: Due to beaver activity and heavy rains, portions of the trail are underwater. A gravel detour trail has been made around a flooded area near the play area south of SW Hall Blvd. Use caution when moving through this area.

Volunteering: Extensive volunteer opportunities are available to plant trees and shrubs, remove invasive species, and provide stewardship of THPRD natural areas are available on our website: <http://www.thprd.org/activities/nature/volunteer/park-improvement> These are open to individuals, small groups, and families.

Asphalt pathway improvement projects: The asphalt pathways are being made at the Beaverton Creek Wetlands and Pioneer Park.

Concrete sidewalk improvement projects: Sidewalk repairs are in progress at Scotts Wetland Natural Area and Waterhouse, Linear Park, the project will continue through December.

Willow Creek boardwalk: Staff has completed the installation of two additional test areas of surface decking material the new material installed is a recycled plastic lumber material. Staff is requesting feedback from boardwalk users on both test areas and materials as we go through the rainy season.

HMT Skate Park (Phase 3): Patrons selected the new design via an online survey; the design that was chosen received more votes by an overwhelming margin. The project has been sent out for bids; the quotes are due back by December 5th. The project is scheduled to be completed by March 31, 2018.

Winter registration: currently is underway.

Canyon Road Streetscape Project Open House. In partnership with the Oregon Department of Transportation, the city is working to [improve SW Canyon Road](#) between SW Short Street and SW Hocken Ave. The goal is to enhance the existing streetscape by creating a sense of place with trees, sidewalks, center medians and a new crosswalk. The new streetscape will increase downtown pedestrian connectivity. It will also improve highway safety, signal operations and access to transit on Canyon Road. An open house in support of the project [was held yesterday](#), Monday, Dec. 11. Participants learned more about the project, spoke with project staff and had an opportunity to provide feedback.

Overnight camping update. Homelessness and overnight camping on city streets continues to be a major topic of interest for the city. The City Council has discussed this issue a few times and as a result city staff have drafted an ordinance for their consideration. The ordinance as drafted would prohibit overnight camping on all public streets in Beaverton. It is scheduled to be discussed at a Work Session at the Dec. 12 City Council meeting with an anticipated Public Hearing date of January 16, 2018. (Please monitor the city's Council Meeting website for any future changes in dates).

Holidays and package theft. We see an increase in reports of package thefts from porches during the month of December. Here are some steps you can take to try to avoid becoming a victim this holiday season:

- Have the package sent to your work.
- Schedule the delivery when you will be home.
- If you order from Amazon, choose to use Amazon locker.
- If your package is being sent by UPS, choose to pick it up at your local UPS Store.
- Require a signature on delivery.
- Create an account on FedEx Delivery Manager or UPS My Choice. This will allow you to track, reroute and reschedule your package delivery.
- Install a video camera at your door as a deterrent.
