Welcome and introductions.

Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue

Dan, a paramedic talked about cardiac issues being the number 1 killer. If we don't feel right, we should make the call for assistance. The rescue team has a cardio machine and drugs to help, while St Vincent's hospital gets the Cath Lab ready to remove a blockage.

Beaverton Police Department – Officer Garbutt says to look outside to see what is happening in your neighborhood. He says to call the business office if you have questions about Police activity. He reported on happenings in the area:

Mayor Dennis Doyle spoke on the positives and the benefits of Beaverton.

- The diversity of Beaverton
- The tax rate will not be increased for fiscal year 2009 - 2010
 - There will be no cost of living increase for city employees
- Promoting businesses and family wage jobs in Beaverton
- Starting the Kennedy "Victory" Garden for food banks donation
- Developing a Public Art plan
- Beaverton Community Vision effort will activate
- City Recycling event
- Studying the city for possible urban renewal eligibility
- The City Council is taking a more established role in the city.

The group briefly discussed concerns with the Mayor; tenants rights, a bicycle crossing at Hall and Greenway Park, Panhandlers, National Association of Mental Illness, and the Beaverton tree code. Mayor Doyle encouraged the group to email him with community concerns.

Minutes from the Vose NAC meeting of May 18, 2009 were approved with the removal of Nicky Fleming's name as a board member in attendance at the meeting. She is not a board member.

Treasurer Report – Balance in checking is \$1858.85.

BCCI Report – Henry Kane

Harry Bodine, spoke at the BCCI meeting regarding the Libraries and that the current levy is to expire in 2011. There will be on the 2010 ballot, a continuance of the levy request.

Randy Ealy, the new Assistant to Mayor Doyle was introduced. He spoke of his experience in Estacada as the City Manager. He is pleased that Beaverton has a staff to assist him. He shared information about Estacada's Urban Renewal.

The Natural Hazards Mitigation Steering Committee is required to revise the plan every 5 years. The city is looking for a qualified volunteer to assist.

The BCCI would like a representative at the Washington County CCI.

Community Concerns

A crosswalk is needed across Lombard between 5th street and Allen Blvd. There may be grants available. The traffic department is a good starting point.

The Land Use Hearing for the Habitat for Humanity project will be presented to the Community Development Department. Henry Kane will attend. Henry says the staff indicated the application is complete and that a 2nd hearing is not needed. He will research the Beaverton code and the forms filed.
