Captain Smith: Beaverton Police Department

- Working on webpage and social media to keep in touch with community and updating of reforms.
- BPD in no way condones what happened to George Floyd.
- Formal Outreach
 - National Night Outreach
 - Coffee With a Cop (Monthly).
- Looking for Recruits - Establishing a good relationship with high schoolers.
- Working to continue outreach to minorities, veterans and youth.
- Community Policing
 - Community Academy (twice a year).
 - Stay engaged and transparent.
- Info on Protesting
 - Has been peaceful and orderly.
 - Police look to give those who are protesting, parameters to stick by.
 - They are also prepared for those who come in and are not being orderly.
 - March planned in Beaverton.
- Camping Policy
 - No camping on public property.
 - 4 bicycle cops dedicated to homelessness.
- School Resource Program
 - Police Dept. continues to fund the program. Schools also fund an in-school officer.
- Requirements of Beaverton Police Officers
 - 90 credit hours beyond high school or equivalent work experience.
 - 90 credit hours of college or military experience.
 - Training - 6 to 8 weeks of orientation. 14 to 16 weeks with Police Academy for more training. Then assigned a coach and extensive field training.
 - All in all, it's about one year and six months a probationary period.
 - Internet is spreading misinformation regarding trading policies.

Mark Hokkanen: THPRD

- Dealt with re-opening – have guidance tool, (phase 1 and 2). Baseline ironing out differences between local and state.
- Upped gathering from 10 to 25 people.
- Opening summer camps right after July 4, and opening playgrounds.
- Summer Camps - No team sports or swimming.
- Started a virtual rec center online.
- Starting back in March, had to lay off 800 ploys for seasonal work.
- Elsie Stuhr Center - No plans to open at this time.

Franziska Rose: City Update

- Washington county is in phase 1 of re-opening.
- Library to remain closed until further notice.
- Do not return books until libraries are open.
- There will be a tree planting program offered through the library.
- Public Emergency Center - On track for opening early July.
- Housing and unemployment assistance is available through city website.
