## Program Descriptions of Recommended Grant Recipients

### **Adelante Mujeres, Chicas Youth Development Program**

Provides a culturally competent after-school program offering academic support and leadership opportunities to Latina youth in grades 3-12. Funding goes towards staff salaries for the five staff facilitators in Beaverton.

### **Arabic House School in Oregon, Youth Support**

Provides culturally specific Arabic language instruction, cultural classes, and family support in an afterschool program housed at the Garden Home Recreation Center. Funding will pay for classroom materials, marketing, and operational costs for the volunteer staff and teachers.

### **ASSIST, Beaverton Disability Benefits Project**

Provides services to support Beaverton residents with disabilities in obtaining the disability benefit income. Funding goes towards staffing costs, including a Benefits Specialist to assist clients with the filing process.

### **Assistance League of Greater Portland, Operation School Bell**

Provides clothing to homeless students in the Beaverton School District. 100% of the funding is used to purchase clothing at wholesale prices and gift cards to Fred Meyer for middle/high school students.

### **Beaverton Education Foundation, Safe and Sound 4 Student Success**

Provides afterschool academic support combined with athletics for low-income and at-risk middle school students. Funding goes towards staff (teachers and coaches) and safe bus transportation home.

### **Girls Inc of the Pacific Northwest, Beaverton Girls Group**

Provides after-school, girls-only, research based curricula that emphasizes life skills, pathways to higher education, and academic success. Funding supports three staff facilitators for the Beaverton groups as well as program supplies.

### **Holy Trinity Catholic Church, Backpack Program**

Provides food for backpacks to enable families to make complete, nutritious meals that feed the entire family. Food includes beans, rice, pasta, and tuna fish sent home with low-income students.

### **HomePlate Youth Services, Street Outreach and Drop-In**

Provides expanded outreach capacity to serve homeless youth by training and utilizing community outreach volunteers, as well as an additional night of drop-in hours. Funding pays for the .4 FTE of the volunteer coordinator's salary and youth expenses.

### **Kinship House, Healthy Living Beaverton**

Provides outpatient mental health services to foster and adopted children and their families, in partnership with Bridge Meadows Beaverton. Funding supports staff salaries and program supplies.

### **Meals on Wheels People, Beaverton Senior Nutrition Program**

Provides daily, nutritious meals for older adults in the Beaverton area at the Elsie Stuhr Center dining room and delivery to homebound seniors. Funds will be used to purchase food for the program.

### **Oregon Food Bank, Food Distribution**

Provides expanded the distribution of fresh and nutritious food at the school pantry at Greenway Elementary School and hunger relief services at Bilal Mosque. Funding will support outreach, food, supplies, translation, volunteer support, and program staff salaries.
