RECOMMENDED ACTION:

City Council approves the Social Services Funding Committee recommendations for a supplemental grant allocation in FY 2019-2020.

HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE:

Social Services Funding Grants are provided on an annual basis through a competitive process to nonprofit organizations addressing the needs of low-income Beaverton residents. Priorities are determined by City Council and currently target: housing/homelessness, affordable afterschool and educational programming, and health. The Social Services Funding Committee (SSFC) is made up of seven Beaverton residents recruited through the annual Boards and Commissions process.

City Council approved an allocation for additional funding for the Social Service Funding grants on May 21, 2020. The Social Service Funding Committee convened on June 3, 2020, to decide on a recommendation for the \$50,000 of funding. The committee recommends allocating the funding to hunger-relief organizations that have been vetted by the committee previously, recognizing that these organizations are seeing an exponential increase in need by Beaverton residents as a result of COVID-19 and have continued to provide essential needs to the community.

INFORMATION FOR CONSIDERATION:

The SSFC recommends the following organizations as recipients for Council consideration and approval, for a total of \$47,500. City funds will be used to deliver hunger relief services to the residents of Beaverton.

- Bethel Congregational United Church of Christ (Outreach Committee): \$15,000
- Meals on Wheels (Beaverton Program): \$10,000
- Murray Hills Christian Church (Casey's Corner Food Pantry): \$10,500
- St. Matthew Lutheran Church (SCAT Program): \$4,000
- Waste Not Food Taxi: \$8,000
