**WHEREAS,** International Women's Day celebrates the economic, political, and social achievements of women; and

**WHEREAS,** women have been leaders, not only in securing their own rights of suffrage and equal opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other movements, especially the peace movement, which create a more fair and just society for all; and

**WHEREAS,** International Women's Day acknowledges the obstacles women still face in the struggle for equal rights and opportunities and their central role in creating positive change; and

**WHEREAS,** according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median weekly earnings for women were 82 percent of what men earned for equivalent work in 2020; and

**WHEREAS,** women worldwide are still denied educational opportunities, with about 132 million girls out of school in 2020 internationally, according to UNICEF; and

**WHEREAS,** gender equality in education and in the workforce benefits everyone; and


