Hello Mickie:

I hope you are doing well.

As previously discussed, the City of Beaverton needs to hold a Special Election on September 21, 2021, to conduct a run-off election for City Councilor Position 1. This position became vacant December 31, 2020, when Councilor Lacey Beaty resigned from Council to assume the office of Mayor. The Beaverton City Council declared that seat vacant in January 2021 and called for a Special Election on May 18, 2021, to fill that position.

On June 15, 2021, the Council adopted Resolution No. 4729 declaring the official results of the May 18, 2021, Special Election, based on the canvass of votes and Abstract of Votes prepared and certified by your office. Since no candidate received a majority of the total number of votes cast for Councilor Position 1, the Beaverton Charter of 2021 requires that a run-off election between the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes must be held at the election that is next available pursuant to state law—in this case that is September 21, 2021.

Per the official election results and the Beaverton Charter and City Code, below are the names of the two candidates who received the highest number of votes for City Councilor Position 1. Please place their names on the official ballot to be used in the precincts of the City of Beaverton, Oregon, at the Special Election of September 21, 2021.
